This is an ongoing project for 2022, so case studies contributed at any time are also encouraged.

About the project

ANZASR will facilitate the compilation of cases over 2022 through a combination of workshops and online discussions. With Australia and Aotearoa New Zealand being world leaders in Surf Science and Surfing Resource Management, the Australasian Coast and Ports conference provides the perfect launch pad for this project. Feel welcome to forward this invitation to others who may be interested. All contributed material will be compiled into a database that will be readily shared. Themes from the contributed cases will be analysed and classified and contributors invited to participate in this process will be listed as co-authors of the publication.

Contribute to the project

We are looking for case studies that exemplify more or more tangible research needs, which are identified in the template (see below). The details required at this stage are brief (but can be expanded on later). Cases studies will be accepted so long as they exemplify new research needs (i.e., not already identified in an existing contribution). Therefore, join the collaboration early if you're interested in participating as an author. Cases that exemplify more specific research needs are better.
